For those wishing to receive the bread and wine at your seat, let the usher know. The priest will come to you before the end of the distribution.

For those not receiving, you are invited to come forward for a blessing (indicated by crossing your arms over your chest). If you have not been baptized, and find yourself drawn to Jesus Christ and life in him, please let our clergy know. We would be honored to have a conversation with you about the possibility of baptism, or any other questions. Baptism and life in the Body of Christ is open to all.

We welcome children to join us in church for all or part of the service. We are blessed to have a family room available for those wishing to be able to hear the service while tending to the special needs of their children. The entrance to the family room is located across from the restroom outside the door located on the left side of the church

There will be childcare available today during the worship service for children's ages 2-5 in room Seven of the Education Center.






The Word of God

The First Lesson Acts 2:1-21

Reader A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs — in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."




Reader A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

The Gospel

John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15

Reader The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said to his disciples, "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning. I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: about sin, because they do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."

The Sermon

The Nicene Creed

The confusion of Babel has been undone with the gifts of Pentecost. May our community mature in wisdom as we come to understand the language of the Spirit. And to this, let us say:

Hear us, Lord. Alleluia.

Our week of weeks is accomplished. Our Fifty Days are complete. May all of us, both the living and the dead, be raised into the splendor of endless Easter. May we hold before God's life all in need *(pause)*. And to this, let us say:

Hear us, Lord. Alleluia.

In the Anglican Communion, we pray for The Anglican Church of Canada; in our Diocese for the clergy and people of St. Matthew's, National City, in the Military Cycle of Prayer for USS Russell (DDG 59); and in our parish for Karen Benedict. And to this, let us say:

Hear us, Lord. Alleluia.

For Michael, our Presiding Bishop; Susan, our Bishop; Kirby, our Priest; Nancy, our Deacon; and all priests and other ministers; and all the people of this congregation who minister in Christ's name. And to this, let us say: *Hear us, Lord. Alleluia*.

For the richness and diverse cultures in the church and the essential role of intercultural dialogue and development; And to this, let us say:

Hear us, Lord. Alleluia.

As our delegates prepare for the 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church in Louisville, Kentucky, June 23-28, 2024, let us surround Bishop Susan, Rachel Ambasing and the Rev. Hannah Wilder with our support and care. May their wisdom, experience and steadfast faith be a beacon, representing our diocese well in all convention deliberations and decisions. And to this, let us say:

Hear us Lord, Alleluia

We pray for our own needs and thanksgivings either silently or aloud. (The People may offer their own intercessions.) And to this, let us say:

The Priest says a concluding collect.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen*.





He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. *AMEN*.







Coffee Hour Snack Schedule: Here is a suggested schedule for helping to provide snacks for Coffee Hour (if you are able) after church on Sundays. **First Sunday -** those whose last name starts with **A-F. Second Sun.** - last name starting with **G-L. Third Sun.** - last name starting with **M-S. Fourth** Sun. - last name starting with **T-Z.**

This week's offertory anthem, "Ev'ry Time I Feel the Spirit", is an unattributed song from before the Civil War. The earliest known performance of the song was attested by a woman named "Aunt" Mary Dines, an escaped slave from Maryland who for a time served as the Lincoln family's private cook. She also cooked for displaced slaves at Camp Barker, which was along one of Abraham Lincoln's routes into and out of Washington, D.C. At one point during the Civil War (1861-1865), President and Mrs. Lincoln were treated to a performance by the residents, including this song. According to Dines, the President was moved to tears and returned again on another day to hear more singing. The song was first published in 1907. Ethnomusicologist Natalie Curtis Burlin (1875–1921) became involved in studying the culture of African American students, culminating in four small volumes of "Negro Folk Songs" (1918–1919). The second volume contains a careful transcription, in full harmony, of "O ev'ry time I feel de Spirit." Burlin recorded the names of the singers that taught her the song, all from Virginia. Her description of the affect of the song gives some sense of how the song was performed: "Of all the spirituals, this is one of the most touching in its prayerful suggestion and quiet reverence, and in the poetic imagery of its verse, couched in a few crude words, elemental in their simplicity, yet somehow conveying the grandeur of the vision of God on the mountain-top and the dazed soul beholding heaven in wonder."


