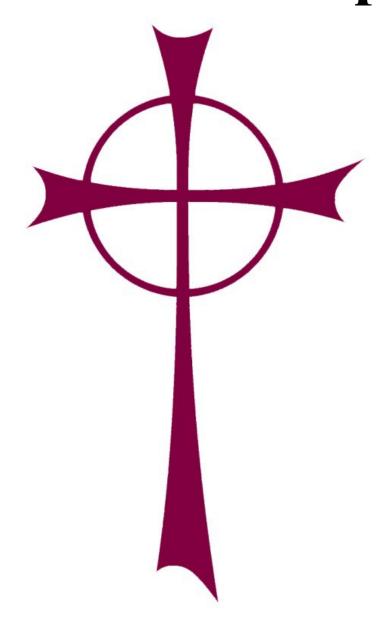

Annual Report of the Interim Priest in Charge, Called: June, 2022

St. David's congregation is filled with gifted faithful persons. I saw and felt this immediately on arrival.

As I said in one of my first sermons, together in community you have everything you need to move forward as servants of Christ!!

Yes, in later 2022 we dealt with some challenges. We continued to emerge restrictions of COVID. We needed to make some organizational changes to deal with our new status as an Action Plan Parish(APP).

We are called to adapt our ministry list to a workable number that can be accomplished without volunteer burnout.

And we strive to acknowledge and repair old wounds as well as grieve beloved lay and ordained ministers who have moved on.

So Parish leadership wisely engaged the Rev. Dr. Eric Law to help us on our journey. His prayerful presence and system of Holy Currencies: Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries have been our guide to new energy and insights.

App team members, Jan Romerdahl and Equilla Luke brought skills in finance and human resources.

On Wednesdays, I organized weekly meeting of your talented staff, Treena Roman, Parish Administrator/Bookkeepr; John Mark Harris, Music Director; and Karen Garcia; Pre-School Director. We learn from each other and have become a more cohesive team.

I meet with your wardens weekly to discern best organization of our liturgy and programming, and campus.

To serve our online parish community who cannot attend church in person, six new Eucharistic Visitors are now trained and ready to carry out Holy Communion and prayers.

A fabulous Stewardship team partnered with the whole parish to maintain pledge dollars at nearly regular levels even though we lost some members to transfers and passings. Thanks to all for their prayers and support.

Elaine Turnbull, Leslie Cohan, and Frances Warren began post-covid Sunday School on line and in person with a Children's sermon on the second Sunday of the month.

A pastoral care work group chaired by Roseann Myers is developing a system to see that all are served.

I offer thanks to God for a very fruitful six months. So, dear God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit we humbly ask that you continue to be our vision and we live into 2023.

SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

2022 Started out hopeful for a good new year.

We wished her well and started to consider our next steps in another transition.

March - The Vestry was informed that the Standing Committee had voted for St. David's to be an Action Plan Parish so we could gain the support and guidance from a team from the Diocese to help us.

April – We celebrated Easter and said a tearful good-bye to Pastor Jocelyn and her family.

May – We were able to enjoy Holy Eucharist and inspiring sermons thanks to clergy friends. Thank you to Deacon Phil, Father Sanders, Father Swartz, Father Cherian, and Mother Kate for providing clergy support until we were assigned an Interim Priest.

June - We welcomed Mother Susan Astarita and our APP representatives, Jan Romerdahl, Equilla Luke. We have been working and learning together since then.

July – Vestry continued learning about the APP process while providing information to the APP team.

August – The Preschool was able to move back into their classrooms after having spread out into the Mission Center during COVID.

September - The Mission Center was cleaned and refreshed in order to welcome groups and activities back on our campus. We met Dr. Rev. Eric Law who led helped us Celebrate St. David's and look towards the future. We decided that we wanted follow-up workshops. We are learning to respect each other and improve our communication skills. We are honoring our current ministries while determining who we want to be as we prepare for a new Strategic Plan.

October – Stewardship guided us through our season of Joy in giving. The Vestry had an inspiring retreat with Deacon Nancy Holland. The Parish audit from the Diocesan representative was successfully completed with high praise for our processes. Well done Treena and team.

November – Rev. Dr. Eric Law provided more workshops to expand our conversation and teach us skills to RESPECT /

St. David's Music Ministry

The music of St. David's grew by great strides last year. The choir increased in size, with 11 members in 2022. The choir rehearses and sings almost every Thursday and Sunday, and on special liturgies.

We enjoyed Holden Evening Prayer during the Mondays of Lent and Advent, and our new Holiday Sing-Along was a great success in December. We had an Easter Vigil service for the first time in years. We also had two wonderful guest musicians this year, organist Jenny Nowlan on Sunday, and flautist Marion Garver on Christmas Eve.

We have worked hard to have good sound amplification in the sanctuary, and online. Technology is always an ongoing project, but we have had good results with consistent work and process. We have had outreach success with our work on Facebook and YouTube, and are seeking ways to utilize them more.

St. David's Music continues to work with the preschool. The children have regular chapel time with music, as well as special events such as the upcoming celebration of St. David's Day.

We have made operational improvements, including the choir now rehearsing in the Ed Center. Our workspace and storage have improved, which has helped with organization. We have improved the organization of our volunteers to help make things happen. The help of Dave Holland on Sunday has been tremendous. We are also very happy to have a budget increase in the coming year, so that we can upgrade our music program.

We also continue to provide space for student recitals, including the SD Suzuki School of Music which uses our sanctuary a few times every year.

Without our volunteers, the choir, none of this would be possible. They are the primary worship leaders of the volunteers. This year, they included Karen Benedict, Gail Decker, Rob Grjalva, Anne Kellett, Lynn Nicholson, Debby Park, Loral Priest, Jack Vellis, Mercedes Webber, Joy Wolf, and Jamie Wood, with Bill Myers playing guitar.

We are especially indebted to Mother Susan's guidance and support. With her leadership we can continue to improve the cooperation and effectiveness of the church's ministries. The effort of the music ministry is to serve those who are currently a part of St. David's community, those in the future, both live and online.

Our Children's Chapel met on zoom every Sunday. Covid restrictions kept us from meeting in person. In May, we finally met in person and on zoom. There was no program from June 5-Oct. 2. This was our summer break. In October, we came back in person and on zoom. The classes were set for 9:15-10:10 am in the library. This gave parents a chance to attend church live/online at 9:30. We used the Whirl program. It follows our liturgical schedule. We had 8 children registered for Sunday school at the beginning of the year. In the fall we had 6. We

have an average of 3 live/2 zoom participants each week. We appreciate our parents that help set-up the children each Sunday online. They also have been very good about helping us supplement our program by printing coloring pages, assisting with art projects and activities each week.

We had 5 youth members. At the beginning of the year, we were meeting, by zoom, with the youth from St. Paul's Cathedral and Christ Church Coronado on Tuesday evenings doing the Whirl, Re-form program. We took the summer break. In the fall, the other youth groups decided to meet in person at Christ Church. That was not an option for St. David's youth. In the spring of 2022, we offered a confirmation class online. We had 4 confirmands in June. Two were Rev. Hughes' sons. In the fall we only had 2 youth. We have not had an active program. Our youth are invited to join Diocesan Youth Collaborative Programs.

In June, we requested new leadership for our Children and Youth. It did not happen. In September, Leslie, Frances, and Elaine stepped up to support our children's ministry. Thank you to our volunteer leaders working with our children and youth.

MINISTRIES OF SERVICE & JUSTICE

Ministries Of Service & Justice 2022



St. David's is called to show compassion (taking time to listen, give a helping hand, recognize one another as children of God), serve and seek justice for our neighbors far and near. As the pandemic's effects lessened, St. David's has offered activities for our congregation to support – through time, talent, money or prayer.

The Service & Justice Committee was saddened by the departure of Pastor Jocelynn at the end of May. Before she left, however, she conducted a Blessings in a Bag activity for the Preschool children who packed 40 bags to distribute! Our Committee continued to meet and welcomed Mother Susan Astarita as a member when she joined St. David's as our Interim Priest-in-Charge in June. The current members are Mother Susan, Debby Park, Father Wayne Sanders, Roseann Myers, Emily Porensky, Joy Wolf, Mercedes Webber and Karen Lenyoun. We meet on the third Thursday of the month from 10-11 am on Zoom. Please let a committee member know if you are interested in joining us.

Debby Park continues to convene **the bi-monthly Zoom meetings of the Diocesan Service & Justice Coalition.** This group is a loosely organized gathering of Outreach and Service & Justice coordinators from churches all over our Diocese to share and inspire us with what they are doing, sometimes asking for support for their ministries from other parishes.

The following is a summary of our ministries this past year. The term "Jubilee" is included because St. David's has been a Jubilee Center of the Episcopal Church since 1984, continuing to do ministries of Compassion and Justice.

SERVICE & JUSTICE/JUBILEE MINISTRIES 2022

BAY PARK HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE: St. David's once again served as the "hub" for this annual neighborhood food drive, organized by Maryann Augustine of Frontline Realty Group, to benefit the San Diego Food Bank. Bags were prepared by volunteers (including several of our parishioners) in the Ed Center on a Wednesday morning in November and then distributed to neighbors after Thanksgiving for them to fill with non-perishable foods. On Dec. 3, the bags were collected from neighbors' homes and brought to St. David's parking lot where they were sorted and placed in storage bins by volunteers and youth from many churches. A few days later, over 7200 pounds of food were delivered to San Diego Food Bank – a big success and a great community effort! Many thanks to Maryann Augustine of Frontline Realty Group who coordinates everything and to Elaine Turnbull who is our St. David's liaison to help Maryann.

BLESSINGS IN A BAG: This year we conducted only one Blessings in a Bag event in May where parishioners helped donate supplies and then prepared about 40 bags to distribute to needy persons we might see as we drive around town. The bags have bottled water, juice, canned fruit & sausages, some form of carbohydrate, a sani-wipe, and a prayer card! Since Pastor Jocelynn had done this with the Preschoolers during Lent, the total of bags prepared was 80. We hope to schedule more Blessings events this coming year.

CELEBRATION OF THANKS (THANKSGIVING DINNER (for seniors on Thanksgiving Day): It does not seem possible for St. David's to carry on this tradition of 35 years because we no longer have the man/woman-power to provide and prepare all the food. There is also concern about having so many elderly people congregating in close surroundings for a meal.

COMMUNITY CHRISTIAN SERVICE AGENCY (CCSA): Our neighborhood emergency aid agency that St. David's helped establish over 45 years ago provides food & clothing to the needy and help in obtaining IDs & referrals to programs for which people are eligible. St. David's provided 49 backpacks for their School Backpack Drive in August – 25 were filled with supplies, 24 were empty to be filled with supplies CCSA had received. We put out collection bins on Sundays for items CCSA requested to help their clients – empty medicine bottles, jeans, sunscreen, flip-flops, hygiene supplies, along with food and clothing donations. For their Christmas Food Basket and Gift Bags for the Homeless programs we adopted a few families and collected items for the gift bags.

COOKIES FOR KAIROS: The Kairos Prison Ministry Weekend was finally able to return to Donovan Prison in August, after a 2-year absence! They put out the word to churches throughout the county to bake cookies for the inmate participants. We responded and donated 15 dozen. We missed the Junior DOK girls who used to bake about 20 dozen for Kairos! There should be another weekend in the spring of 2023, and we'll try to recruit more bakers.

COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM: We were able to conduct an Evening Prayer service for the patients somewhat sporadically on the 2nd and 5th Sundays. On December 18, **parishioners signed Christmas cards** which Debby Park delivered to the patients that afternoon, and we sang Christmas carols! Debby and Father Wayne are the main service providers.

#CREATION CARE IN LENT: Pastor Jocelynn inspired us to participate in this Lenten activity. We took pictures of what we were doing to take care of our environment during Lent – eating homegrown fruits &

vegetables, observing Meatless Mondays, conserving water, recycling in various ways – and posted them on Facebook!

EPISCOPAL COMMUNITY SERVICES (ECS): ECS is the outreach arm of the Episcopal Diocese of San Diego. In May, we asked for donations and created two Gift Baskets and donated one quilt made by Mercedes Webber for their Gala Silent Auction. In October, our church and preschool collected 62 pumpkins for an ECS Head Start Harvest Festival. On Nov. 17, a few parishioners donated food and helped serve at the ECS CERRC (Central East Regional Recovery Center for substance abuse) Thanksgiving Lunch for their clients and staff.

EPISCOPAL REFUGEE NETWORK (REFUGEE.NET): The Episcopal Refugee Network is an institution of the Episcopal Diocese of San Diego which focuses on providing educational and enrichment opportunities for elementary, high school and preschool age refugee children and helps families become self-sufficient. St. Luke's in North Park continues to distribute food every Thursday to refugee families. St. David's is now collecting rice, beans, cooking oil and canned goods to help their Food Bank. They now have a catering service called Mama Africa which is sponsoring dinners and cafes at St. Luke's. Mama Africa can be found on Facebook and Instagram.

INTERFAITH SHELTER NETWORK: The Network is a collaborative effort by local congregations and human services agencies to provide shelter, meals, services and resources to unhoused San Diegans. Again in 2022, the Network was unable to provide the Rotational program where guests stay in host churches, but did house them in hotels. However, late in 2022, they were able to restart the host church rotations. **St. David's can no longer be a host church; we decided that our model of cubicles where guests would sleep was no longer safe to keep people from exposure to disease.** But we offered to provide pillows to the first church in the Clairemont rotation, and 5 of us will be Overnight Hosts there in January.

RACHEL'S WOMEN'S NIGHT SHELTER: Three times a month (every 2nd Wed., 4th Fri. & 4th Mon.) a team from St. David's prepares an evening meal for the 30 women at Rachel's Night Shelter downtown on 8th Ave between F & G streets. We fix a main dish, salad, dessert, and provide fruit, milk, and juice. This was one of the few ministries we were able to continue during the pandemic by dropping off the meal rather than staying to serve it (in order to protect ourselves and the women from possible exposure to COVID-19). Finally, starting around June we were allowed to come in and serve which feels SO good! The manner of serving is slightly different so as to minimize contact with the women, so only two of us help serve at a time. Many thanks to our wonderful cooks: Jean Payne, Debby Park, Katy Finn, Melinda Murdock, Adriana Vamosiu, Harriet Carmona, Jan Bauman, Jean Hemingway, Frances Warren, Ann Whalen and subs Carolyn Lief, Terri Smith & Cathy Meagher. On Dec. 26, Melinda Murdock of the 4th Monday Team again took gift bags with fun items donated by parishioners and other supporters. Many thanks to Melinda for organizing the gift bags. The women were thrilled with the gifts and always love the dinners St. David's provides.

ST. DAVID'S PRESCHOOL is an important part of our Outreach to the neighborhood and our community. We are so blessed that the Preschool has remained open since July of 2020 and is thriving, especially now that they have moved back downstairs. John Mark Harris provides music instruction alternating on Tuesdays with Father Wayne and Debby Park who lead Chapel songs and stories. We hope to include Preschool families and children in more service projects, such as the Blessings in a Bag, Pumpkin Drive and Holiday Food Drive that we did with them this year.

AA, AL-ANON & OTHER GROUPS: The Thursday Mens AA group who had returned to meeting inperson at St. David's helped us again by fixing up the Men's Restroom in the Ed Center. Now both Men's

and Women's restrooms are usable there! Other groups that have returned are Al-Anon, Women's AA, and Friday AA Mixed. The Forest Park Homeowners Association has come back, too!

the elements that impact our operations such as wage parody, the shifting developmental and support needs of young children and families, as well as how the transitional kindergarten programs now accepting younger children will impact our potential future enrollment and program. The goal would be to make the key changes that will position our program to be competitive in this economy and more importantly to meet the needs of young children on a deeply transformational level.

I wish to thank all who support the preschool as a whole, and me as the director such as the Vestry, Executive Committee, and Finance Committee. Thank you to our chapel leaders The Reverend Wayne Sanders, Debby Parks, and John Mark Harris who pray, tell us stories, and sing with us as we learn to worship in its many forms.

Most especially, I wish to show my appreciation of our teaching team who lives out your mission of service to our young children and families each day. Of course I could not do any of this work without the loving, capable teaching team--kudos to Zyntia, Nikki, Cindy, Stephanie, Jaime, Kendra, & Kaylie for the caring and passion they put into our children and families!

FACILITY

The Arts Commission

Another project is on our wish list: Lenten banners for the sanctuary. We are also exploring a new "pulley system" for raising and lowering the banners, thus eliminating climbing on very a very high ladder. Dave Holland, our Sexton and David Priest are working on this together.

Facility Maintenance (Jr. Warden Report)

Education Building:

- -Low flow toilets (4) installed to replace high water use toilets in both bathrooms
- -AA group assisted in painting the 2 restrooms to allow use of the bathrooms. The overall use of the Education building will help determine the extent of any further remodeling of the bathrooms and nearby areas.
- -Preschool moved out of the Mission Center and back to the lower level classrooms late August for the start of the new school year in September.

Mission Center:

- -Preschool using 2 sections of Mission center for classrooms until September 2022. They continue to use the Mission Center bathrooms from Monday to Friday.
- -Exit sign batteries replaced (David and Loral Priest)
- -Mission center carpets, kitchen, windows cleaned with dusting of high surfaces after preschool moved.
- -Leaks around the toilet fixtures were caused by tree roots in the plumbing (cleared by CVB Plumbing)

Administration area:

-new flooring, painting, new furniture(office) and cabinets(music and vesting room) completed over several months in 2022.

Sanctuary:

- Roof and Skylight Leaks continue when it rains in area near the choir riser, in southwest corner under the skylight, and the area around the baptismal font. Several efforts by David and Loral Priest have reduced but not solved the issues.
- There is no functioning heat or air conditioning in the Sanctuary. Bids for HVAC and solar are being looked into again as previous bids need to be renewed.

General campus:

- -4 large pine trees on the corner of July/Burgenor were crown thinned Feb 2022, 1 small volunteer pine removed as it was leaning over the sidewalk.
- -Our gardening company with Ivan Garcia continue to work on campus weekly (usually Friday morning). Yard trimmings now need to be placed in a green bin for pickup by EDCO and are not supposed to be dumped in the trash bin.
- -exterior and parking lot lighting is being reviewed by our Facility Caretaker (Dave Holland) to coordinate the time the lights turn on and replace bulbs.
- 2022 has welcomed Dave Holland as Facility Caretaker. His typical work days are Friday, Sunday and Monday. He works 15 hours. His work is both for the church and preschool. He also has another job outside St Davids. Please make any requests by writing to the office so his hours can arranged optimally.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer's Summary Report Year-End 2022

What an interesting year it has been, to say the least. Due to the ongoing Covid pandemic, 2022 began with worship being online only in January and February, with our first service together on Feb. 27, 2022. Then in March we learned that our pastor moved on to a new position and St. David's was placed in an "Action Plan Parish" status. The good news is, we continue to strengthen ourselves financially so that we can plan for our future with hope and confidence. Below are highlights from 2022:

2022 IN REVIEW:

- 1. <u>Diocesan Audit</u> Harry Jasper, Controller for the Episcopal Diocese of San Diego (EDSD) conducted a full-scale audit of St. David's Finances on October 18, 2022. The results were excellent. While we have not received the official report, Harry made this comment to Treena Roman on his way out: "You are a godsend to this church. You are doing a fantastic job and you should be a model for other churches in all things finance." This was very good news indeed!
- 2. <u>Building Improvements</u> a major accomplishment in 2022 was the new flooring and paint in the Administration Offices, Sacristy and Music Rooms. We were also able to purchase new furniture for the Admin offices. These areas had not been updated since they opened in 1996. Most of the furniture was left over from the Annual Rummage sales. The project cost of \$35,000 and was paid for by proceeds from the Verizon Cell Tower Income Sale.
- 3. <u>Verizon Cell Tower Proceeds Plan 2.0</u> as most of you may recall, at the end of 2021 St. David's sold its rights to the Verizon cell tower monthly lease income. We patiently negotiated nearly 15 years' worth of monthly income totaling \$700,000. The Vestry worked with the Diocese to come up with an acceptable

proceeds plan that was approved in December 2021. However, due to numerous changed circumstances (pastor departure, rise in interest rates, AT&T cell tower possibility) the Vestry agreed that the Verizon Cell Tower Proceeds Plan should be modified. In December 2022, the following plan was approved by the Standing Committee of the Diocese:

\$700,000 \$120,000 Verizon set aside 3-yrs; began March 1, 2022 through March 1, 2025 at \$3,200 a month \$580,000 \$35,000 New flooring and paint in the Administration Offices, Sacristy and Music Rooms (spent) \$545,000 \$30,000 Placed in savings cash reserve at First Citizens (done) \$515,000 \$15,000 Search Process Expenses \$500,000 \$350,000 Capital Projects* \$150,000 set aside for Salary Enhancement for Future Priest *\$350,000 Identified capital improvement projects \$150,000 for HVAC for Sanctuary/Admin Bldg/Education Bldg. \$150,000 rooftop solar system \$20,000 cleaning and painting outside of buildings \$20,000 replace leaking skylights \$10,000 Sound system

A Facilities Committee, chaired by David Priest, will be working on getting the capital improvement projects completed.

- 4. Paycheck Protection Program Loans St. David's received two paycheck protection loans, the first in May 2020 for \$108,000 and the second in February of 2021 for \$75,000. These were government funded forgivable loans to help small businesses maintain staffing levels during the coronavirus. We received notifications that the smaller loan was forgiven in January 2022 and the larger loan was forgiven in March 2022 with the exception of \$3,000. We paid the \$3,000 and petitioned for a review. This loan is currently being reviewed with the hopes that it will be forgiven fully.
- **5.** Endowment Fund Update St. David's Perpetual Endowment Fund (the Fund) was created in 1989 and according to the Fund Charter "was established to provide a permanent, inflation adjusted investment base to generate earnings for use in St. David's Operating Fund." The Fund consists of two managed investment accounts:
 - 1) <u>T. Rowe Price Equity Income Fund</u> with the objective to "seek a high level of dividend income and long-term capital growth primarily through investments in stocks" (balance on 12/31/2022: \$32,167).
 - 2) <u>Dodge & Cox Stock Fund</u> with the objective to seek long-term growth of principal and income by primarily investing in a diversified portfolio of equity securities" (balance on 12/31/2022: \$16,570). Each year the Treasurer is responsible for calculating the minimum asset base according to instructions in the Fund Charter. In March of 2022 the minimum asset base was set at \$49,740. If the value of the Fund is above the base, the Vestry may use it to supplement the Operating Fund. If the Fund falls below the base amount, the Vestry must wait for the value to rise above the base. For example, on 12/31/22 total value of the two funds = \$48,737 which is below the base so the Vestry must wait until the value increases. 2022

was not a good year for stocks and according to Forbes the S&P 500 fell almost 20%, its worst year since 2008. (As an aside, at the time of this writing, both funds had increased in value.)

Another investment fund was started by Bishop Mathes for St. David's (and each congregation in the Diocese) in 2013. This fund is a mutual fund managed through the Diocesan Investment Trust (DIT) and currently has a value of \$270. This fund is also available to use for gifts and savings. The Stewardship Committee will assist the Vestry in educating the parish about all of the available ways to save for St. David's future.

2022 INCOME AND EXPENSE S vs. 2021 INCOME AND EXPENSES (Church Only)

2022 Church inc/exp ended with a **negative net income figure of (-\$31,604)**. The balance in the Operating Accounts (BofA, First Citizens and PayPal combined) at year-end was \$65,142. The balance in the Endowment Funds on 12/31/2022 was \$48,737.

The negative net income is largely due to the Administration Office, Sacristy and Music Room upgrade with new flooring and paint (total amount = \$35,000). However, as shown below, the church was able to cover this deficit with \$67,000 in transfers from the Bank of America Savings Account (\$35,000 for the Admin Offices flooring and painting and \$32,000 to replace 10 months of Verizon monthly income approved in Proceeds Plan).

2023 LOOKING AHEAD

Total pledge amounts decreased in 2023 to \$210,710 from the 2022 amount of \$222,930. Pledging units decreased to 41 in 2023 from 47 in 2022. The Finance Committee recommended and the Vestry passed a 2023 Budget with a year-end projected deficit of (\$22,000). The deficit will be covered by the ongoing Verizon replacement money transfers of \$38,400.

The Vestry continues to explore other opportunities for revenue as churches continue to wonder what does the future look like? For now, St. David's Church & Preschool is in a safe financial place as we work towards a healthy and promising future.
